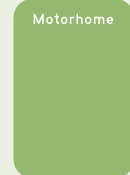
CAR & CARAVAN

MOTORHOME

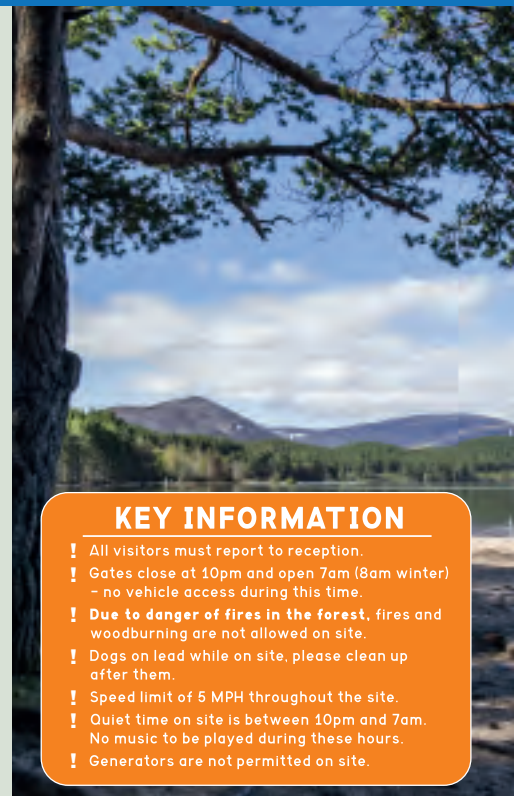
Pitch Marker



Please note:
Pitches in the forest are defined by the surrounding trees.

To avoid the spread of fire there must be at least 6 metres between facing walls of adjacent outfits.

To help us keep you safe, please park with rear offside or front nearside of caravan or motorhome to the numbered pitch marker. If you wish to park in a different way, please check with site staff. On hardstanding pitches, the caravan / motorhome and awning must use the hardstanding pitch and not encroach onto the grass.



KEY INFORMATION

- ! All visitors must report to reception.
- ! Gates close at 10pm and open 7am (8am winter) - no vehicle access during this time.
- ! Due to danger of fires in the forest, fires and woodburning are not allowed on site.
- ! Dogs on lead while on site, please clean up after them.
- ! Speed limit of 5 MPH throughout the site.
- ! Quiet time on site is between 10pm and 7am. No music to be played during these hours.
- ! Generators are not permitted on site.

SITE INFORMATION

RECEPTION

When reception is closed, an emergency contact number will be displayed on the door. Gates close at 10pm and open at 7am. No vehicle access or movement between these hours. Local tourist information is available at reception, please do not hesitate to ask the site wardens for anything you need help with.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE

Pitches are available from 1pm until 8pm on the day of your arrival.

You are requested to leave your pitch at 11am on the day of your departure, if you wish to extend please come to reception between 9am & 11am.

ARRIVALS WHEN RECEPTION IS CLOSED

Please read your map for pitching instructions and site rules. Please come to reception between 9am and 10am the following morning to let us know you arrived.

PITCHES

To help us keep you safe, please pitch as instructed at check in. If you are unsure, please speak to one of the site wardens and they can come and assist you. All units need to be 6 metres apart to avoid the spread of fire. Below is a pitching guide, keep the pitch marker pole to the left of your unit unless otherwise instructed. All awnings must be on the pitch and not encroach onto the grass.

TENT FIELD

Please display your tent tag on your guy line at all times, do not pitch on yellow grass and make sure you are 6 metres from any other tent.

SPEED LIMIT

The speed limit onsite is 5mph, as there are often young children playing, we ask you to take special care when driving on site.

BARBECUES & FIRES

Due to the danger of wildfires in Glenmore Forest Park and the by-law for the area, we do not allow charcoal barbecues or fires on site. This includes wood burning in enclosed cooking equipment. We are a gas cooking only site.

GENERATORS

Please note that generators are not permitted on this site.

DOGS

Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times whilst on site. Please be courteous and always clean up after your dog. There is a maximum of three dogs per pitch.

WINTER CONDITIONS AT GLENMORE

The Cairngorm Mountains are excellent for skiing, you can call the mountain for daily ski runs available on 01479 861261.

The campsite is 300 meters above sea level and in the winter the site temperature is between -3 to as low as -22. Please make sure you have to hand a number for your recovery service, a snow shovel, snow chains, extra blankets and sufficient food.

ENVIRONMENT & WILDLIFE

We are very lucky at Glenmore Campsite to be surrounded by wildlife and nature. Please be respectful and do not disturb or chase our local wildlife. Bird feeders are allowed on your pitch, we just ask they are off the floor and you remember to take them home. The forest surrounding the campsite is part of the ancient Caledonian pine forest so please help us protect it by avoiding activities that may cause damage to the trees and surrounding environment.

NOISE

Please keep noise at a level which will not disturb other campers, especially between 10pm and 8am.

CYCLING

Cycling in the National Park is permitted on public roads and waymarked routes only.

RECYCLING & GENERAL WASTE

You will find bin compounds around the site, please help us help the environment by recycling where possible and using the correct bins. Follow the signage on the compounds for instruction.

VISITORS

If you are expecting any visitors please be reminded that they should park and pay at Reception.
