RECEPTION

All visitors must report to reception. Opening times will be displayed at Reception. When Reception is closed an emergency contact number for the Site Manager will be displayed on the door.

Local tourist information is available at Reception. For more information on the area, please do not hesitate to ask the Site Team.

Gates close at 10pm and open 7am (8am winter) - no vehicle access during this time.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE

Pitches are available from noon until 8pm on the day of your arrival.

You are requested to vacate your pitch by 11.00am on your day of departure.

If you wish to extend your stay, please contact Reception before 10.00am on your departure date. Permits issued at Reception must be on display at all times.

SPEED LIMIT

The speed limit onsite is 5mph, as there are often young children playing, we ask you to take special care when driving on site.

BARBECUES

Due to the danger of fires in the forest, fires are not allowed on site.

Barbecues may be lit provided they are raised off the ground. Gas and charcoal BBOs only and must be extinguished by 10pm, no wood burning in the Cairngorms National Park.

Please ensure that smoke and fumes do not annoy other campers.

In times of very dry weather, when the fire risk is high, the use of barbecues may be restricted.

GENERATORS

Please note that generators are not permitted on this site.

WILDLIFE

Please do not feed or pet the animals in and around the area. Campers are advised not to approach the animals. They may look friendly, but they can be unpredictable and please keep food sealed and out of reach.

If an animal is causing a persistent problem please advise the site staff.

ENVIRONMENT

Washing lines and tree swings are strictly prohibited on our sites.

Likewise we do not permit fireworks or den building on or around the pitches.

NOISE

Please keep noise at a level which will not disturb other campers, especially between 10pm and 8am.

CYCLING

Cycling in the National Park is permitted on public

ARRIVALS WHEN RECEPTION IS CLOSED

If you arrive when Reception is closed please read the signs and maps displayed on Reception door for pitching instructions.

Please return to Reception in the morning between 9.00am - 10.00am to pay and collect your permits.

PITCHES

Please note that due to fire regulations you must pitch at least six metres away from anyone else. You will be asked to repitch if this rule is not adhered to. You will find fire extinguishers in prominent places around the site, please make yourself aware of where these are located.

One windbreak is permitted per pitch, with a maximum of six poles.

DOGS

Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times whilst on site. Please be courteous and always clean up after your dog. There is a maximum of three dogs per pitch.

WINTER CONDITIONS AT GLENMORE

For weather updates please visit **www.mwis.org.uk** The campsite is 300 meters above sea level and in the winter the site temperature is between -3 to as low as -22. Please make sure you have to hand a number for your recovery service, a snow shovel, snow chains, extra blankets and sufficient food.
